**FINANCIAL AID**

Sending your children to international programs can be a very exciting opportunity for them, but sometimes families have concerns about the cost of providing these opportunities. Because CISV is a totally volunteer organization, the costs of our programs are quite reasonable relative to other international opportunities that you might investigate for your children. However, we recognize that some families may need additional financial support, so the Smoky Mountain Chapter strives to help defray some of the costs for those families who could not otherwise participate in CISV programs. Partial financial assistance may be available to applicants receiving Invitations to Travel. A confidential Financial Aid Application (including the disclosure of personal financial records) is required. Determination of assistance will be based on applicant need and availability of the Chapter's financial aid funds.

If you think you may be interested in financial aid should your child be selected for a program, please note the following dates and processes for financial aid applications:

- December 2, 2016 Program Applications Due (child and parent interviews)
- December 22, 2016 Invitation to Travel Letters Sent to Applicant
- January 6, 2017 Financial Aid Applications Due
- January 10, 2017 Financial Aid Decisions Emailed to Applicants
- January 18, 2017 Commitment Date – invited applicants must confirm participation in a program by this date
- January 29, 2017 Celebration Tea for program delegates and leaders

All details provided on the financial aid application form will remain confidential with the scholarship committee. Estimated budgets will be provided to serve as a guide when requesting funding. Because this is a non-profit volunteer organization, we will ask for a reconciliation of expenses at the end of the program. This can be used to increase aid (when possible) if expenses are significantly more than anticipated; this can also be used to determine reimbursement to the Chapter for any unused funds. In this way we can continue to help other families in the future.
